Juryreport:

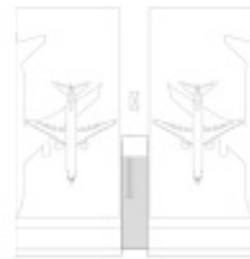
The inspiring design for an airport terminal for low cost airlines fits the brief perfectly. The designer has set himself the task of developing for a real-life location a terminal that is fully tailored to the specifications of low-cost airline companies. And in this he has certainly succeeded. To begin with, the scheme slots magnificently into its landscape setting. The designer has responded intelligently to local circumstances, keeping the terminal ensemble at a respectful distance from the existing village and making full use of the on-site differences in level. The whole goes far beyond the existing plan developed for the airport by a specialist firm. An architecture of clarity and simplicity matches the function to perfection. In the super-efficient 'machine' all components are arranged concisely and logically so travellers get to where they have to be with ease and at speed. There is at the same time an attractive spatial quality to the architectural treatment of this airport infrastructure brief. Also worthy of mention is the methodical approach. All the relevant aspects have been researched; every design decision is to the point and clearly presented. All told, this is a complete, well-considered and extremely consistent plan.

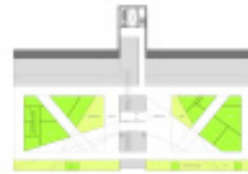

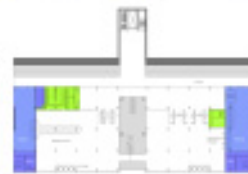
